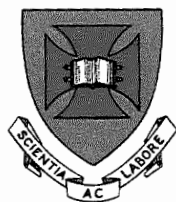

PROFESSOR HERBERT JOHN GARNHAM HINES

MR. CHANCELLOR,

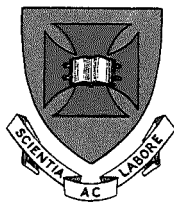
TONIGHT WE HONOUR A MAN WHO HAS SERVED THIS UNIVERSITY IN MANY CAPACITIES FOR 42 YEARS. PROFESSOR HERBERT JOHN GARNHAM HINES HAS PLAYED A DISTINGUISHED ROLE IN THE HISTORY AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND.

HE JOINED THE UNIVERSITY ON JANUARY 1, 1929 AS A LECTURER IN AGRICULTURAL CHEMISTRY, TO LECTURE WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY TO STUDENTS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE. IN THE SECOND HALF OF 1935 HE ASSISTED IN LAUNCHING THE MEDICAL FACULTY BY ORDERING THE LABORATORY EQUIPMENT FOR THE EMBRYONIC DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOLOGY, BY ADAPTING THE PREMISES IN WHICH THE NEW DEPARTMENT WAS TO BE HOUSED AND BY GIVING LECTURES IN BIOCHEMISTRY AND PHYSIOLOGY UNTIL THE FIRST PROFESSOR OF PHYSIOLOGY ARRIVED LATE IN 1936. HE WAS APPOINTED LECTURER IN BIOCHEMISTRY IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOLOGY ON JANUARY 1, 1936. DENTISTRY AND VETERINARY SCIENCE STARTED AS UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENT AT MUCH THE SAME TIME, AND FROM THIS TIME ON HE LECTURED IN BIOCHEMISTRY AND PHYSIOLOGY TO MEDICAL, DENTAL AND SCIENCE STUDENTS AND LATER TO PHARMACY STUDENTS.

HE THUS PLAYED AN ACTIVE PART IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE FACULTIES OF AGRICULTURE, MEDICINE AND DENTISTRY. INDEED HE TAUGHT EVERY MEDICAL STUDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY UNTIL ABOUT 1965.

FROM 1936, HE CARRIED ALMOST THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE DIRECTION OF THE TEACHING OF BIOCHEMISTRY UNTIL AN ADDITIONAL APPOINTMENT, SPECIFICALLY IN BIOCHEMISTRY, WAS MADE IN 1947. DURING THE LATE 1930'S AND 1940'S THIS SECTION IN BIOCHEMISTRY HAD DEVELOPED WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOLOGY

UNDER HIS DIRECTION, AND HE WAS FORMALLY APPOINTED ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF BIOCHEMISTRY IN 1949 TO HEAD THE BIOCHEMISTRY SECTION, UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE PROFESSOR OF PHYSIOLOGY. PROFESSOR HINES' EFFORTS LED TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF BIOCHEMISTRY AS A SEPARATE DEPARTMENT IN JANUARY 1961, AND HE WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DESIGN OF THE BIOCHEMISTRY BUILDING WHICH WAS OPENED ON JUNE 8, 1962.

THE SENATE RECOGNISED HIS MAJOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO THIS UNIVERSITY BY APPOINTING HIM TO A PERSONAL CHAIR ON MAY 2, 1963. IN 1968 HE ACCEPTED THE INVITATION OF THE FACULTY OF SCIENCE TO SERVE AS DEAN FOR THE FOLLOWING YEAR, AND HE HAS CONTINUED IN THAT IMPORTANT OFFICE, AND IN THIS, HIS FINAL YEAR AT THE UNIVERSITY, HE IS STILL VERY ACTIVE AS DEAN OF THIS LARGE FACULTY.

THERE ARE FEW RECORDS OF ACADEMIC SERVICE TO BE COMPARED WITH THIS ONE, AND I CAN SAY IN ADDITION, MR. CHANCELLOR, THAT PROFESSOR HINES HAS ENDEARED HIMSELF TO GENERATIONS OF STUDENTS AND STAFF THROUGH HIS SPLENDID PERSONAL QUALITIES. HE IS HELD IN THE HIGHEST REGARD BY ALL OF US.
