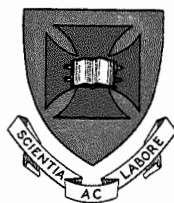

"MR. CHANCELLOR,

MAY I PRESENT TO YOU PROFESSOR TEAKLE, ACTING VICE-CHANCELLOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND."

ACTING VICE-CHANCELLOR'S ADDRESS.

After his address the Acting Vice-Chancellor moves to the second lectern, the Marshal brings Mr. Roberts to him and the Acting Vice-Chancellor says:

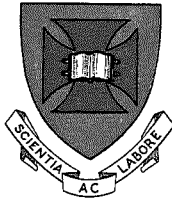
"MR. CHANCELLOR,

ONE OF THE REWARDS OF TEACHING IS THE KNOWLEDGE THAT A TEACHER'S WORK EVENTUALLY AFFECTS THE LIVES OF MANY MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY, IN BECOMING HEADMASTER, A TEACHER ASSUMES A MUCH HEAVIER BURDEN OF RESPONSIBILITY. FOR OVER 45 YEARS, HENRY EMMANUEL ROBERTS HAS BEEN A TEACHER - AT SCOTS COLLEGE SYDNEY, AT IPSWICH AND TOOWOOMBA GRAMMAR SCHOOLS, AND AT THE BRISBANE CHURCH OF ENGLAND GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

HE HAS ALSO DISCHARGED THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF HEADSHIP, AND SINCE 1947, HE HAS BEEN HEAD OF THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND GRAMMAR SCHOOL. IN THE LIGHT OF ADVANCES OF EDUCATIONAL PRACTICE, HE HAS BUILT ON THE RICH TRADITION OF THE SCHOOL, AND HAS MAINTAINED AN EXCELLENCE OF EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCE FOR THE PUPILS OF HIS SCHOOL FOR WHICH A GREAT MANY MEN ARE NOW DEEPLY GRATEFUL. THE ADMIRABLE WAY IN WHICH HE HAS SERVED EDUCATION HAS EARNED HIM THE RESPECT, AFFECTION, AND ADMIRATION DUE TO A GREAT HEADMASTER.

HE HAS BEEN GENEROUS IN MAKING HIS TALENTS AVAILABLE TO THOSE WHO SEEK THEM FOR SOCIETY'S GOOD. HE HAS BEEN ACTIVE IN, AND HAS HELD EXECUTIVE POSITIONS IN, ASSOCIATIONS OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS, THE AUSTRALIAN COLLEGE OF EDUCATION OF WHICH HE IS A FOUNDATION MEMBER, PUBLIC EXAMINATION BOARDS, THE AUSTRALIAN BROADCASTING COMMISSION STATE ADVISORY BOARD, AND MANY OTHER WORTHY BODIES.

HIS CIVIC CONTRIBUTIONS WERE RECOGNISED BY THE AWARD OF AN O.B.E., AND THE GRANTING OF A FELLOWSHIP BY THE AUSTRALIAN COLLEGE OF EDUCATION TESTIFIES TO THE REGARD IN WHICH HE IS HELD BY THE EDUCATION PROFESSION.

IN 1956, HE WAS APPOINTED TO THE SENATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND. HE IS ADMIRABLY QUALIFIED TO ADD INSIGHT TO THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY, AND HE HAS PLAYED A VALUABLE ROLE IN THE WORK OF THE SENATE AND ITS COMMITTEES. HE HAS SERVED AS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF THE FACULTY OF EDUCATION AND HAS BROUGHT HIS WIDE KNOWLEDGE OF SECONDARY EDUCATION IN QUEENSLAND TO BEAR ON MANY UNIVERSITY MATTERS. HIS SERVICE TO THE UNIVERSITY AND TO EDUCATION GENERALLY HAS BEEN GENEROUS AND VALUABLE, AND THE UNIVERSITY IS PROUD TO HONOUR HIM.

MR. CHANCELLOR,

I PRESENT TO YOU HENRY EMMANUEL ROBERTS, MASTER OF ARTS, OFFICER OF THE MOST EXCELLENT ORDER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE, FELLOW OF THE AUSTRALIAN COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, SENATOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND, FOR ADMISSION TO THE DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF LETTERS HONORIS CAUSA."

When the Acting Vice-Chancellor concludes, the Chancellor says:

"HENRY EMMANUEL ROBERTS BY THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AND UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE ACTING VICE-CHANCELLOR, I ADMIT YOU TO THE RANK AND PRIVILEGES OF THE DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF LETTERS 'HONORIS CAUSA' IN THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND."

After Dr. Roberts resumes his seat the Marshal brings Mr. Barry to the second lectern and the Acting Vice-Chancellor says:

"MR. CHANCELLOR,

TOM BARRY WAS BORN AT MOUNT ALBION IN NORTH QUEENSLAND AND BEGAN HIS EDUCATION AT A SMALL ONE-TEACHER SCHOOL. HE WENT ON FROM THERE TO GRADUATE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND, AND THEN TO EMBRACE AND PRACTICE TWO PROFESSIONS.
