VICE-CHANCELLOR'S ADDRESS.

After his address, the Vice-Chancellor remains standing at the lectern, the Marshal brings Doctor Robinson to him, and the Vice-Chancellor says:

"MR. CHANCELLOR.

IT HAS PLEASED THE SENATE TO AUTHORIZE THE ADMISSION OF DOCTOR FREDERICK WALTER ROBINSON TO THE DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF LETTERS 'HONORIS CAUSA'.

FREDERICK WALTER ROBINSON GRADUATED FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF SYDNEY IN 1909 WITH A DOUBLE FIRST, IN ENGLISH AND CLASSICS.

WITH THIS WENT THE COUTTS SCHOLARSHIP FOR ENGLISH AND THE UNIVERSITY MEDAL FOR CLASSICS, AND, LATER, THE COOPER TRAVELLING SCHOLARSHIP. HE WAS AWARDED HIS DOCTORATE OF PHILOSOPHY,

MAGNA CUM LAUDE, BY THE UNIVERSITY OF JENA FOR A THESIS IN THE FIELD OF ROMAN HISTORY.

IN 1913 HE WAS APPOINTED ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF MODERN LANGUAGES AT THE ROYAL MILITARY COLLEGE OF DUNTROON. THEN IN 1923 HE BEGAN THIRTY-SIX YEARS OF SERVICE TO THIS UNIVERSITY.

DURING THIS CAREER HE ATTAINED THE RANK OF ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, TEACHING COURSES THAT COVERED THE WHOLE SWEEP OF ENGLISH LITERATURE.

HIS DEVOTION TO THE UNIVERSITY AS A WHOLE IS SEEN, FOR EXAMPLE, IN HIS ENCOURAGEMENT OF THE STUDENT BENEFACTIONS FUND, AND PERHAPS ESPECIALLY IN HIS INTEREST IN THE ST. LUCIA SITE, RANGING FROM THE GENERAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE BEAUTY OF THE GROUNDS TO THE DETAILED PLANNING WHICH SET THE ARMS OF THE WORLD'S UNIVERSITIES ON THE CLOISTER PILLARS.

THE UNIVERSITY IS UNIQUELY INDEBTED TO FREDERICK ROBINSON, NOT ONLY FOR THESE SERVICES, BUT ALSO FOR HIS ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FRYER MEMORIAL LIBRARY OF AUSTRALIAN LITERATURE.

IN THE WIDER COMMUNITY, THE SAME CONCERN INFORMED HIS WISE
AND PERCEPTIVE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE OXLEY MEMORIAL LIBRARY FOR
OVER TWENTY YEARS AND HIS MEMBERSHIP AS A TRUSTEE OF THE QUEENSLAND
ART GALLERY FOR A CONSIDERABLE PERIOD.
